Welcome to New Members: What is the Piedmont Chapter of ARGS All About?

There have been about 30 new members who have joined our Piedmont Chapter of the American Rock Garden Society since March, 1992. I want to sincerely welcome them to our chapter and to the fellowship of a fine group of gardeners. We will publish a complete list of new members that have joined us since March, 1992 in our September, 1992 issue of The Trillium. For these new members I would like to outline the typical year of our chapter. For the 1992-93 year, there will be five program meetings instead of the typical four. They will be held in September, October, November, 1992 and January and March, 1993. All meetings are held at the Totten Center of the North Carolina Botanical Garden, Chapel Hill, NC at 10:00 am on the third Saturday of the month. Any changes in this schedule will be announced in the newsletter prior to the meetings. There are five issues of The Trillium, our chapter newsletter, per year. It is issued in September, November, January, March, and mid-

A typical meeting of our chapter is as follows: check in prior to 10:00 am for your name tag, social period, opening announcements, speaker's program, closing announcements and business, plant "show and tell" time, refreshment break, auction of gift plants (plant mini-auction sale) and books and other activities. The meetings are typically completed by noon. Each person in attendance is asked to register. This record is useful to the chairman in various ways; for example, in dividing the alphabet for members' refreshments schedule.

Plants play a vital role in our chapter's activities since they provide the funds for obtaining speakers outside our membership. Our September meeting is very special in that, aside from our first speaker of the year, members contribute seedlings, rooted cuttings, plant divisions for the annual *members only* bargain sale. Dilley in this issue of *The Trillium*. At all other meetings (except September), members are invited to bring in a special plant or flower for a brief "show and tell" period. Many of these plants are frequently donated for the mini-plant auction that we have at our meetings (except September).

Sometimes members will share a book or tell us about a special gardening tool or perhaps a clever gardening hint they've run across. There may even be a gardening problem that you would like to share.

The social committee of our chapter supplies the coffee and tea at our meetings; members bring in "goodies" based on an alphabetize schedule of your last name. Because there are five meetings this year (1992-93), the following is a tentative schedule for persons to bring in cookies, breads, cake, cheeses, dips etc.: Persons whose last name begins with A - E should bring in "goodies" at the September meeting; F-H for October; J-M for November; N-R for January; and S-Z for March. If there are any refinements to the schedule, it will be noted in the newsletter.

We have a spring garden tour each year for our members. In April, we hold a nurseryman's day plant sale for the public (and for members, too). Any member of our chapter is eligible to participate (and be a nurseryman for a day!). The sellers donate 10% of the sales to our chapter. The month of May is when the chapter has its annual spring picnic and final business meeting of the year.

I encourage new members to fully take part in our chapter's activities during the year. Active participation is the backbone of our gardening group. May we develop a strong back!

Plan Now for the Piedmont Chapter's Fall Seedling Sale

Every September our chapter holds an annual plant sale to promote the exchange of interesting, rare, unusual, and hard to find plants among our chapter members. The sale is also a primary source of revenue for our chapter since the receipts from sale of all plants that are donated by our members go to our treasury.

As a plant contributor, plan to provide a dozen or so choice plant seedlings which would be appreciated by the other members. Plants can be propagated from cuttings, divisions, seeds, or bulbs. Clearly label each pot separately with the correct name. Plants will be priced according to size and rarity—generally between \$0.50 and \$2.00. Those plants which are extremely rare or hard to find may be priced at \$5.00.

Members who contribute plants to the sale will be allowed to chose two plants before the rest of the chapter members are permitted into the sales area. Last year our fall plant sale netted \$425 for our chapter treasury; let's exceed that amount this year.

By participating in this plant sale, we can continue to support our Piedmont Chapter. We will also be sharing and obtaining new plants from our fellow gardeners. So get busy now and pot up some plants for the sale. Remember, the plant sale will be held on Saturday, September 19, 1992 at the Totten Center at the NC Botanical Garden. It will be held immediately after our speaker's program. And you must be a currently paid member of our chapter to participate in the sale.

Who Are We—the Piedmont Chapter of ARGS?

The Trillium is the newsletter of the Piedmont Chapter of the American Rock Garden Society (ARGS). It is published five times a year in January, March, mid-summer, September and November. The newsletter is distributed to all Piedmont Chapter members, to presidents and/or newsletter editors in each of the other 28 chapters of the ARGS; to the editor of the Bulletin (the national newsletter of the ARGS); and as sample copies to local prospective members.

On an additional note: this issue of The Trillium is renewal time for most of you. How do you tell if your renewal is due? Simply check the four digit code on your mailing label on this issue. The 92 or 93 indicates the year (1992 or 1993); the second set of digits indicate the month: e.g., 07 means July. Thus 9207 means your membership expires in July of 1992.
